KARL DEUTSCH AWARD



The purpose of the Karl Deutsch Award is to honour a prominent scholar engaged in the cross-disciplinary research of which Karl Deutsch was a master. The recipient presents the Karl Deutsch lecture at the IPSA World Congress of Political Science. The Karl Deutsch Lectures are published in the International Political Science Review. The award is made on the recommendation of the IPSA Committee on Organization, Procedures and Awards (COPA). It is supported by the Karl Deutsch fund.

Karl Wolfgang Deutsch (1912-1992)

Born in Prague, Karl Deutsch immigrated to the US in the late '30s. He taught at the MIT, Yale, and Harvard. He assumed the role of President of IPSA from 1976-79. He was also President of the American Political Science Association and director of the International Institute of Comparative Social Research at the Science Center in Berlin. He passed away in November 1992.

Deadline: November 1, 2017

Amount - \$1,000 US (1 recipient)

The prize is of \$1,000 US for one winner.

Funding: Karl Deutsch Fund

Lecture at the 2018 IPSA World Congress of Political Science in Brisbane.

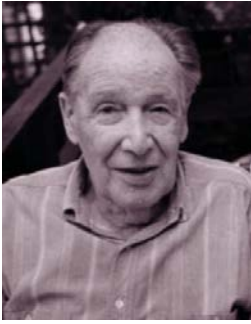

JUAN LINZ PRIZE



The purpose of the Juan Linz Prize is to honour a prominent scholar engaged in the **Decentralization, Multinational and Multiethnic Integration and Federalism Comparative Research** of which Juan Linz was a master. The recipient presents the Juan Linz lecture or leads a special session at the IPSA World Congress of Political Science. The award is made on the recommendation of the Committee on Awards. It is supported by the Juan Linz fund.

Juan Linz fund was created and sponsored by the EUSKOBAROMETRO observatory of the University of the Basque Country, is open to new other institutional participants and managed by the Spanish Political and Administrative Science Association.

Amount – 3,000 USD (1 Recipient)

The prize is of \$3,000 USD for one winner.

Funding: Juan Linz fund

PRIZE OF THE FOUNDATION MATTEI DOGAN AWARDED BY THE INTERNATIONAL POLITICAL SCIENCE ASSOCIATION FOR HIGH ACHIEVEMENT IN POLITICAL SCIENCE



The **Prize of the Foundation Mattei Dogan awarded by the International Political Science Association for High Achievement in Political Science** is offered to a scholar of high international reputation in recognition of his/her contribution to the advancement of political science. The prize is awarded at every IPSA World Congress of Political Science.

The recipient for 2018 will be invited to present a prize lecture during the 25th IPSA World Congress of Political Science in Brisbane, Australia, and will receive 5,000 USD from the Foundation Mattei Dogan.

GLOBAL SOUTH AWARD



Established to recognize the work done by a scholar from the Global South, and whose scholarly contribution is focused on the relevant countries/ regions/ themes. This award also recognizes cumulative body of work. It was awarded for the first time at the 2009 World Congress of Political Science.

The award recipient will be invited to present a prize lecture during the 2018 IPSA World Congress of Political Science and will receive \$1,000 US.

Amount - \$1,000 US (1 recipient)

The prize is of \$1,000 US for travel expenses for the IPSA World Congress for one winner. The cash prize is the total award; no further reimbursement is to be awarded to one winner. Lecture at the 2018 IPSA World Congress of Political Science in Brisbane.

Application Deadline: April 1, 2018

Guidelines for application

The following are the criteria for the award:

- Recipients must originate from the Global South and deal with Global South issues
- Global South countries are considered as non-OECD countries. Applicants from OECD countries listed below are **not eligible** for the prize:

Applicants for the award are expected to submit:

1. a curriculum vitae,
2. a statement of the nature of the research project and an indication as to how it is of significance to the Global South;
3. a letter of reference from an academic familiar with the applicant's work certifying his or her academic status and indicating his or her suitability for the award;
4. a representative sample of written work whose length should not be greater than a scientific journal article

The IPSA Committee on Organization, Procedures and Awards (COPA) will assess candidates' written work.

* IPSA also invites related IPSA research committees to nominate candidates.

STEIN ROKKAN TRAVEL GRANT AWARD



The Stein Rokkan Award is one of the IPSA travel grants that the association began offering its members in the early 1990s. The purpose of the Stein Rokkan fellowships is to assist a small number of graduate students to attend the world congress by covering their basic travel and accommodation costs. The recipients receive financial assistance towards travel and subsistence. The awards are made on the recommendation of the IPSA Committee on Organization, Procedures and Awards (COPA), and they are supported by the Stein Rokkan fund.

Stein Rokkan (1921-1979)

A promoter of social and political science, Stein Rokkan contributed greatly to the field of comparative politics, notably during his teaching years at Bergen University. He assumed the role of President of IPSA from 1970-73. He was also Vice-President of the International Sociological Association, Chairman of the European Consortium for Political Research (which he helped found), and President of the International Social Science Council.

Amount - \$1,000 USD

The prize is of \$1,000 USD for basic travel and accommodation costs for the upcoming IPSA World Congress of Political Science.

Observations: Up to 2 recipients may share the award of \$1,000 USD

Application deadline - April 1, 2018

Guidelines for application:

The following are the criteria for the award:

1. each candidate must be registered in a degree granting programme;
2. normally candidates must be at the doctoral level but in exceptional cases where qualifications and money allow students at master's level may be considered;
3. candidates must demonstrate that their academic institutions and professors have bestowed on them high academic honour and esteem.

1. a curriculum vitae,
2. a statement of the nature of the research project and an indication as to how it could benefit from participation in the congress;
3. a letter of reference from an academic familiar with the applicant's work certifying his or her academic status and indicating his or her suitability for the award;
4. a representative sample of written work whose length should not be greater than a scientific journal article;
5. a statement indicating financial need in respect of the costs of attending the congress.

The committee on awards will assess candidates' written work.
